WHAT IS URBAN RUNOFF?

URBAN RUNOFF can be harmful, and even lethal to our creeks.
Water in our gutters drains to our creeks and groundwater.
For example, whenever cars are being washed, and when driveways and sidewalks are hosed down, fertilizers, pesticides, litter, and pet waste, go into the creek as urban runoff.



Things You Can Do to Prevent Runoff Pollution of our Creeks

Never pour anything into a storm drain or gutter.

Recycle used oil.

Limit the amount of fertilizer you use on your lawn or garden.

Don't fertilize when rain is forecast.
Use chemical pesticides only if you have a
major pest problem, and never in wet
weather.

Pick up after your pet.

Don't litter. Cigarette butts and trash from the streets are washed into our gutters, which drain to our creeks

Choose a Clean Water Business Partner to clean your carpets, landscape your yard, and change your motor oil.
